BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

Individuals in the collection include Edwin S. Carey, his son, Alvin B. Carey, and his son, Alvin B. Carey, Jr.

Edwin Carey was born in Columbus, Ohio, in 1875, but he later moved to Indianapolis with his wife, Lillian (b. 1885), and probably worked for the Lieber brewing company in the 1910s.

Alvin B. Carey (b.1908) lived his entire life in Indianapolis and worked as a skidder laborer. He married Martha D. Stewart in 1927.

Alvin B. Carey, Jr. (1928–1998) also lived in Indianapolis. He served in the U. S. Navy from March, 1946–October, 1947.

The collection contains a variety of items from members of the Carey family. Among the items is a panoramic photograph from the H. Lieber Company's Employee Benefit Picnic, 16 June 1912; items from World War I including a bound copy of the President's War Message, 1917, a bound volume of the pictorial history of war, 1918, and an Army Corps of Engineers overseas hat; materials from Alvin Carey Jr.'s time in the U. S. Navy in the Pacific including photographs, postcards, photograph of a "Marine Swallow" ship, advertising for the Bataan Cafe, and a good luck token.
