BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Frieda B. Crickmore was born September 5, 1910 to Owen and Ida Crickmore in Indianapolis, Indiana. She had one younger sister, Kathleen. Frieda attended Washington Elementary school and graduated on June 13, 1924. Four years later she graduated from Technical High School. Frieda married Gerald Gary on April 24, 1929, and they lived with her parents. Gerald and Frieda continued to live with her mother and sister after Owen's death in 1930. Gerald worked as a mechanic and then a cooker for the government. During World War II, Frieda was certified as a member of the Air Raid Warden Corps. She passed away on February 8, 2004 at 93-years-old.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection contains Frieda B. (Crickmore) Gary's Indianapolis Public Schools Elementary Department completion certificate for Washington Elementary School. It was signed by Mary Sweeney, Frieda's teacher, and Lydia Plarich, Washington's principal on June 13, 1924. Also included is Frieda's Technical High School of Indianapolis diploma. It is signed by the principal of Technical (also known as Arsenal Technical High School); Charles Miller, the superintendent of public schools; and Theodore Vonnegut, president and F. Reissner, secretary of the Indianapolis Public School Board on June 14, 1928. There is also an Indiana Civil Defense Certificate of Appointment for Frieda to become a member of the Air Raid Warden Corps in Marion County, Indiana on October 26, 1942. The certificate indicates that she completed a training course in order to obtain it. It is signed by C. Harvey Bradley, the county director of civilian defense.
