Carbondale Free Press, Sept 5, 1885

BRICKER, Dr. Johnathan, died Sunday in Carbondale, age 75y, 7m, 8d. He was born at Shafferstown, Lancaster County, PA, Jan 12, 1812 and was of Swiss descent. His paternal ancestors having emigrated to America and settled in PA ca. the year 1650. The direct increase from this lineage is now centered near Brickerville in that Co. He was married to Henrietta E. **MUSSER**, a family name honorably connected with the Rev. **STRUGGLE** of Burks Co. on the 2nd of March 1836. He moved to Mansfield, Ohio in 1843, began practicing medicine at age 20; leaving his family in Mansfield, he went by way of Central America to California and stayed for years. In 1854, he returned to his family. In 1858 he moved with his family to Fort Wayne, IND. He came to Southern IL in 1859. Of his family, the widow and four children survive. All residents of Carbondale. W. J. **BRICKER**, the eldest, is a practicing physician, Celea remains at home, Aljena, wife of R. G. **SYLVESTER**, formally [formerly?] of Portland, Main, and R. J. **BRICKER** a well-known druggist of Carbondale whose wife was Miss Fannie **FERGUSON** of South Bend, IND. Buried Oakland Cemetery.

Carbondale Herald, 8 Apr 1893–15 Apr 1893

BOWYER, Jacob, died 6 April 1893, age 78. He was born in Virginia (now West Virginia) on 8 Feb 1815. Came to IL via Ohio and Indiana and settled on the farm in 1837 southeast of Carbondale. He was the father of nine children. Seven survive. George, Theadore, Ellen, William, Elizabeth, **GRANT**, and Iona. He was a civil war vet. (May have had 7 wives)

Carbondale Free Press, Mar 12, 1902

BRADLEY, Ruth J., mother of George B. **BRADLEY**, died at DeSoto. She was born in Posey County, Indiana, Jan 23, 1828 and was 74 yrs., 1m, 17d old at death. She married J. B. **BRADLEY**, July 4, 1844. Surviving members of the family are: Hon. L. M. **BRADLEY** of Mounds City, Geo. B. **BRADLEY** of Carbondale, C. M. **BRADLEY** of Murphysboro, Mrs. G. B. **DAVIS** of Murphysboro, and Mrs. John **BAGWILL** of St. Louis.

The divorce cases that are indexed here are located in the basement of the county courthouse in Mound City with other chancery court files. They are kept in cardboard folders, placed in wooden pigeonhole shelves, and many have been damaged by insects and from water during past flooding.

Sanford A. Tuthill, 1844–1920

Sanford A. Tuthill was born on 23 Oct 1844 [*Illinois Deaths and Stillbirths give birth date as 23 Oct 1843, in Indiana*]. This same record indicates that his father was Charles **Tuthill**. In 1850 we find a Sanford Tuthill, age 8, born about 1842 in Ohio, living in the household of John Sebree and Martha Sebree at Covington, Kenton County, KY. Was Martha Sanford’s mother? Did Sanford’s father die and his mother marry a Seebree (or Seabury)?

Sanford A. Tuthill married first Amanda **Moreland** in Ohio County, Indiana on 26 May 1866. In **1870** Sanford and Amanda are living at Burlington, Boone County, KY where he is farming. At that time the household consists of Sanford, age 28, born KY; Maude, age 22, born IN; John, age 4, born IN; and Lanorah, age 1, born IN.

In **1880** he has moved the family to Hamilton County, Ohio, where he is still farming, and the family includes:

Sanford A., age 37, born Ohio; parents born Virginia.

Amanda, wife, age 34, born Indiana; parents born Indiana. [Amanda (**Moreland**) **Tuthill** was born 6 Nov 1846 at Hartford, Ohio County, IN. She died 15 Aug 1894 at Lawrenceburg, Dearborn County, IN, and is buried in Greendale Cemetery, Dearborn County, IN.]

John, son, age 13, born KY; Father born Ohio; mother born Indiana.

Viola, dau., age 11, born KY; father born Ohio; mother born Indiana.

Charles, son, age 9, born KY; father born Ohio; mother born Indiana.

Lewis, son, age 7, born KY; Father born Ohio; mother born Indiana.

Earnest, son, age 5, born Ohio; father born Ohio; mother born Indiana.

Jesse, son, age 4, born OH; father born Ohio; mother born Indiana.

Albert, son, age 8 mos., born OH; father born Ohio; mother born Indiana.

Sanford A. **Tuthill** married second Jennie Green (age 31) in Dearborn County, Indiana on 2 Jan 1896.

In **1900** Sanford and Jennie **Tuthill** are living in Lawrenceburg, Dearborn County, Indiana, where he is a wholesale Lumber Dealer.

Sanford, age 54, born Oct 1845, Kentucky; wholesale Lumber Dealer. Birthplace of
Parents: Unknown. Married 5 years.

Jennie, wife, age 34, born Dec 1865; born Illinois; parents born England

Fanny M., dau., age 19, born Jun 1881 in Indiana; parents born in Kentucky
Edward E., son, age 16, born Sep 1883 in Indiana; parents born in Kentucky
Myrtle M., dau., age 11, born Nov 1888 in Indiana; parents born in Kentucky
Wilbur, son, age 3, born Oct 1896 in Indiana; father born Kentucky; mother born Indiana

4. Sophia Amelia **Henry** was born 28 Oct 1882 in Illinois; died in Tucson, Pima County, Arizona in Jan 1971. She married Charles M. **Overby** on 4 Jul 1905 in St. Clair County, Illinois. In 1910 they are living in Marissa where Charles works in the coal mines. The family later moved to Girard, Macoupin County, Illinois where we find them in 1920. By 1930 Sophia was a widow and working as an attendant at the Alton State Hospital at Alton, Illinois. [Alton Illinois City Directory, 1930] In 1954 she is living in Evansville, Indiana [Evansville, Indiana City Directory, 1954] In 1955 she is living in Dayton, Ohio with her son Marvin R. [Dayton, Ohio City Directory, 1955] There is a listing for her on Findagrave.com indicating she is buried in Girard Township Cemetery, Girard, Macoupin County, Illinois, Plot: Section G.
